

Well Project

Our new well project at the end of South 44th Avenue, east of Randall park is now starting. You will see the drilling crew start to mobilize into the

will see the drilling crew start to mobilize into the area starting in the next few weeks. Drilling will begin once the site is fully prepped. This well will be approximately 1,400 feet deep and will be in the Ellensburg formation.

Main Line Replacement



Earlier this year, the Nob Hill Water Board approved capital expenditures up to \$650,000 for main line replacement projects. Eight different projects are now scheduled and approximately 15,000 feet of pipe will be replaced over the next two years. The first project kicked off in late September and is on Scenic from 80th Avenue to the East approximately 2000 feet, including 1000 feet of pipe on Vertner Road.

System Maintenance



This year Nob Hill Water will replace 20 older hydrants in the water system that were over 60 years old and difficult to operate. Additionally, a concentrated valve exercising program will be staring this fall, targeting pipes that are likely to fail. Nob Hill Water has been using VODA.ai, a machine learning program that lists pipes by their likelihood of failure.

Meter Leak Detection



After three years, the meter listening maintenance program is still returning excellent results. By listening to each meter, water leaks that are not surfacing are able to be found. These leaking service lines are then scheduled for replacement. This maintenance program has substantially reduced the amount of lost water over the past three years and has also reduced chlorine and power costs as well.
